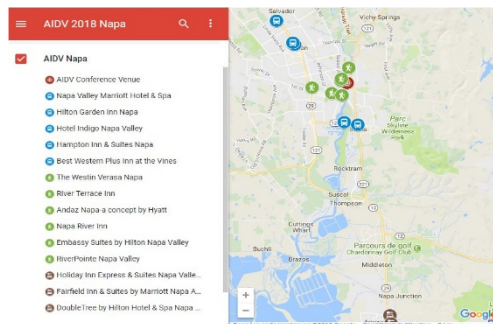
VENUE: The CIA at Copia, 500 1st Street, Napa, California
