Welcome to Verona

estled in the heart of northern Italy, Verona is a city where history, culture, and the art of wine come together in timeless harmony. A UNESCO World Heritage Site, Verona enchants visitors with its elegant Roman ruins, medieval alleys, and Renaissance palaces, all steeped in centuries of heritage.

Internationally renowned as the romantic setting of Shakespeare's Romeo and Juliet, Verona offers much more than literary legend. Its Roman Arena—still in use today for grand operas and concerts—is one of the best-preserved ancient amphitheatres in the world. The city's dynamic cultural life is reflected in its museums, galleries, and annual festivals that attract thousands of visitors from across the globe.

Located at the crossroads of some of Italy's most prestigious wine regions, the city is the gateway to the famed Valpolicella, Soave, and Bardolino vineyards. These hills, shaped by generations of vintners, produce wines that embody the richness of the Veronese terroir—such as Amarone, Recioto, and elegant white varietals. It is no coincidence that Verona also hosts Vinitaly, one of the world's leading wine exhibitions, celebrating the excellence of Italian and international wine traditions.

With its perfect blend of cultural sophistication, historical allure, and enogastronomic prestige, Verona offers an inspiring setting for meaningful dialogue, exchange, and discovery.



The wine region

The wine-growing tradition of Verona is deeply rooted in its landscape, economy, and cultural identity. The province encompasses some of Italy's most storied and diverse wine regions, where ancient viticultural practices are paired with modern innovation to produce wines of extraordinary character and global renown.

To the north lies **Valpolicella**, a hilly area of rolling vineyards and stone-built villages, where Corvina, Rondinella, and Molinara grapes give life to iconic wines such as **Amarone della Valpolicella**—a bold, full-bodied red made using the appassimento method—and the sweet, opulent **Recioto**. These wines are a testament to the region's ability to balance tradition with complexity and depth.

Heading east, one finds **Soave**, home to some of Italy's finest white wines. Made primarily from Garganega grapes, Soave wines are known for their freshness, floral aromas, and mineral elegance, offering a refreshing counterpoint to the intensity of Valpolicella reds.

On the shores of **Lake Garda**, the **Bardolino** and **Custoza** zones provide a gentler expression of Veneto's viticulture. Bardolino reds and rosés (Chiaretto) are light, fruity, and versatile, while Custoza whites are aromatic and pleasantly crisp.

These terroirs—blessed with a favorable climate, diverse soils, and centuries of winemaking expertise—are not only the backbone of Verona's agricultural economy but also a powerful expression of its culture. Wine is a way of life here: deeply tied to food, family, and celebration, and increasingly, to sustainable practices and international collaboration.

For visitors and wine professionals alike, Verona offers a unique opportunity to explore a mosaic of appellations, taste history in the glass, and experience firsthand the vibrancy of one of the world's most respected wine territories.



Tourist activities for accompanying persons



Friday 17 October Verona City Center Tour

Beginning at 2:30 p.m. in front of the Chamber of Commerce of Verona.

You will get a general overview of the city with a walk through the historic center, allowing you to see the Castello and Ponte Scaligero, the Arco dei Gavi and the Roman Gate of the Borsari, the Arena (optional visit inside), the Ponte Pietra and the Roman Theater, including stops at the most characteristic and historically and artistically significant points: Piazza dei Signori, Piazza delle Erbe (break for coffee and bathroom) and Piazza Brà and Arche Scaligere.
